

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen met in regular session April 11, 2006 at 7:00 P.M. in Selmer City Hall.

Present : Mayor David Robinson. Aldermen, John Finlayson, Maurice Hamm, Paul Simpson, John Smith, Harry Smith.

Rev. Greg Worthy of the Eastside Church of Christ opened with prayer.

Motion by Harry Smith and seconded by John Finlayson to approve the minutes. All voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Maurice Hamm and seconded by John Smith to approve the financial statement. All voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by John Smith and seconded by John Finlayson to pass on 1st reading the Ordinance to amend Section 11-1002 of the Zoning Ordinance to allow signs having reversing or rotating panels for display of multiple fixed messages. Amendment by Paul Simpson to table the motion until City Attorney Abernathy could look at the Ordinance. Amendment failed for lack of a second. Roll call on motion as follows: John Finlayson—yes, Maurice Hamm—yes, Paul Simpson—No, John Smith---yes, Harry Smith—yes. Motion carried. First Reading Passed.

Motion by John Finlayson and seconded by Harry Smith to pass on 1st reading an Ordinance to amend Title 13 for the Municipal Code of the Town of Selmer pertaining to Property Maintenance requirements within the city limits. John Finlayson—yes, Maurice Hamm—yes, Paul Simpson—No, John Smith—yes, Harry Smith—yes. Motion carried. First Reading Passed.

Motion by Harry Smith and seconded by John Finlayson to pass on 1st reading an Ordinance to amend Title 9 of the Selmer Municipal Code by adding Chapter 9 regulating Yard Sales within the city limits. John Finlayson—yes, Maurice Hamm—yes, Paul Simpson—No, John Smith—yes, Harry Smith—yes. Motion carried. First Reading Passed.

Motion by John Smith and seconded by Harry Smith to pass on 1st reading an Ordinance to amend Title 9 Chapter 2 of the municipal code of the Town of Selmer relative to Peddlers and Solicitors. John Finlayson—yes, Maurice Hamm—yes, Paul Simpson—No, John Smith—yes, Harry Smith---yes. Motion carried. First Reading Passed.

Motion by John Finlayson and seconded by Harry Smith to pass on 1st reading an Ordinance to amend Title 9, Chapter 2, Section 9-101 of the Municipal Code of the Town of Selmer relative to certain business prohibited on Sunday. John Finlayson—yes, Maurice Hamm—yes, Paul Simpson—No, John Smith—yes, Harry Smith—yes. Motion carried. First Reading Passed.

Motion by Maurice Hamm and seconded by John Smith to pass on 1st reading an Ordinance to amend Title 4, Section 4-609 of the Municipal Code of the Town of Selmer relative to mileage reimbursement for the use of personal vehicles for town business. John Finlayson—yes, Maurice Hamm—yes, Paul Simpson—No, John Smith—yes, Harry Smith. Motion carried. First Reading Passed.

Motion by John Finlayson and seconded by Maurice Hamm to pass on 1st reading an Ordinance to amend Title 5, Section 5-101 of the Municipal Code of the Town of Selmer relative to the Official Depositories of the Town of Selmer. Amendment by Paul Simpson to use the local banks as named within this ordinance if competitive with outside banks. Amendment seconded by Maurice Hamm. All five voted yes on the Amendment. Amendment to the motion passed. Roll was called on the motion as amended. All five voted yes on the amended motion. Motion carried. First Reading passed on the Ordinance as amended.

Motion by Harry Smith to pass on 1st reading an Ordinance to amend Title 8, Chapter 1 of the Selmer Municipal Code concerning the distance requirement between an establishment licensed to sell Beer and a Residence. Motion seconded by John Finlayson. John Finlayson—yes, Maurice Hamm—yes, Paul Simpson---NO, John Smith—No, Harry Smith—yes. Motion carried. First Reading Passed.

Motion by John Smith to pass on 1st reading an Ordinance establishing a maximum amount for purchases without public advertisement and competitive bidding. Motion seconded by John Finlayson. All five voted yes. Motion carried. First Reading Passed.

Motion by Harry Smith to pass a resolution requesting Lieutenant Governor John Wilder and Representative Randy Rinks to sponsor an amendment to the Charter of the Town of Selmer. Motion seconded by John Finlayson. John Finlayson—yes, Maurice Hamm—yes, Paul Simpson—No, John Smith—yes, Harry Smith—yes. Motion carried.

Motion by John Finlayson to donate \$500.00 to the "Books to Birth" Program which is matched by State funds and which will furnish a book per month to children zero to five years of age. Motion seconded by Harry Smith. All five voted yes. Motion carried.
