

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen met in regular session December 9<sup>th</sup>, 2008 at 7:00 P.M. in Selmer City Hall.

Present were: Mayor David Robinson.

Board of Aldermen: John Finlayson, Paul Simpson, Edward Smith,  
John Smith, Lloyd Tennyson.

Russell Ingle of Independent Appeal opened with an appropriate prayer.

Amy Britt of the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Selmer Middle School led the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag.

Motion by Paul Simpson and seconded by Lloyd Tennyson to accept the financial statement. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

John Smith gave special recognition to Officer Kim Holley and the Drug Team for conducting and presenting an excellent Dare Program at the Ramer, Tennessee School.

Motion by John Smith and seconded by Edward Smith to pass on second reading an Ordinance amending the Selmer Municipal Zoning Ordinance by amending the permitted uses in R-3 districts. The amendment of R-3 allows multi-family dwellings (Apartments and Townhouses) and regulation of lot area, lot width, yards, building coverage and height for multi-family dwellings.

All five voted yes. Motion carried. 2<sup>nd</sup> reading passed on Ordinance No. 581.

Motion by Paul Simpson and seconded by Lloyd Tennyson to pass on second reading an Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 574, Chapter 3, Title 10 of the Selmer Municipal Code amending the existing Pit Bull Ordinance by clarifying registration, confinement, and enforcement for “grandfathered” dogs.

All five voted yes. Motion carried. 2<sup>nd</sup> reading passed on Ordinance No. 582.

Motion by John Smith to pass on 1<sup>st</sup> reading an Ordinance amending Title 15 of the Selmer Municipal Code by adopting by reference State Traffic Offenses and Rules of the Road. Motion seconded by John Finlayson. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Edward Smith to pass a resolution establishing a Security Policy for laptop computers and removable storage devices used by the Town of Selmer. Motion seconded by Lloyd Tennyson. All five voted yes. Motion carried. 1<sup>st</sup> reading passed.

Motion by Lloyd Tennyson to pass a resolution establishing procedures for public inspection of, access to and duplication of public records under the Tennessee Open Records Law. Motion seconded by Edward Smith. All five voted yes. Motion carried. 1<sup>st</sup> reading passed.

Paul Simpson addressed the Board wishing everyone a Merry Christmas and thanking all the people who work for the Town of Selmer.

Mayor Robinson added his wishes for Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to all!
