

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen met in regular session February 9th, 2010 at 7:00 P.M. in Selmer City Hall. Mayor David Robinson was present and all five Board of Aldermen as follows: John Finlayson, Paul Simpson, Edward Smith, John Smith, & Lloyd Tennyson.

Rev Homer Watson of Cypress Creek Baptist Church opened with prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag led by little Miss Brenna Anderson.

The meeting room was filled with people concerned with the possible rezoning of lots across from the hospital along East Poplar Avenue for a future medical facilities building. The minutes and financial statements were approved.

Motion by Paul Simpson to pass the second reading of an ordinance amending the official Zoning Map of Selmer the property described a Parcel 26.03, "Group A" of the McNairy County Tax Map 089K as updated April 2006 along Falcon Road from R-3 High Density Residential to M-1 Industrial. (W.T. Yarbrough's Funeral Home.) Motion seconded by Lloyd Tennyson. All five voted yes. Motion carried. Ordinance No 589 passed.

John Finlayson made a motion that based on the unanimous recommendation of the Planning Commission that the first reading of an ordinance be passed to rezone the property along East Poplar Avenue across from the hospital by amending the official zoning map described as Parcels 12 and 12.01, Group A, on McNairy county Tax Map 090I as updated April 2006 from the present R-1 Low Density Residential Zone to H-1 Hospital Zone. This motion died for lack of a second.

Motion by John Smith to approve the personnel policy change as requested by Public Works Director Richard Ashe to institute a \$.25 per hour incentive raise for Utility employees that successfully obtain certifications in Water and Waste Water Treatment. Motion seconded by John Finlayson. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Lloyd Tennyson to adopt a Resolution authorizing filing of a 2010 Tennessee Housing Development Agency known as the Home Program Grant. Motion seconded by Edward Smith. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Fire Chief Anthony Carr presented a proposal for adoption between the Town of Selmer Fire Department and McNairy County Fire Department and Rescue Services to ensure that McNairy County Departments within all stations are provided with administrative services and training at no cost and that the Town of Selmer Fire Department will intern use the equipment as needed to include a 2004 International Fire Truck

Motion by Paul Simpson and seconded by Lloyd Tennyson to accept and endorse the proposal as presented by Fire Chief Carr to provide training and administrative services for Fire and Rescue Departments within McNairy County at no charge for the use of their fire and rescue equipment to include the county owned 2004 International Fire truck. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned.

The Selmer Beer Board met for the purpose of reviewing a Beer Permit Application to sell packaged beer for off premises consumption at Selmer Food Mart located at 1470 East Poplar Ave. following the 7:00 P.M. regular Town of Selmer Mayor and Aldermen monthly meeting February 9th, 2010.

Mayor David Robinson presided and all Board members were present as follows:

John Finlayson, Paul Simpson, Edward Smith, John Smith, Lloyd Tennyson.

The Beer Application of Ayush & Krish LLC to sell packaged beer at 1470 East Poplar Ave. was presented and the persons presently holding a beer license at the same location which was temporarily suspended requested that any action be postponed until after the 16th day of February, 2010 at which time the rightful owner was to be determined from the pending lawsuit. Attorney Abernathy stated that he was involved with one of the parties and could not participate in discussing the dilemma at hand.

Aldermen Paul Simpson explained that since the former license had not been revoked or turned in only temporarily suspended that no action could be taken, and in view of the request the action to issue another license would have to wait until the next meeting giving the court time to decide the rightful owner of the business.
