

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen met in regular session at 7:00 P.M. in Selmer City Hall on September 14th, 2010.

Mayor David Robinson was present. All five Board of Aldermen were present as follows: John Finlayson, Paul Simpson, Edward Smith, John Smith, and Lloyd Tennyson.

Russell Ingle pastor of Fellowship Church opened with prayer.

Adamsville Mayor David Leckner led the pledge of allegiance to the United States flag.

Motion by Paul Simpson and seconded by Lloyd Tennyson to accept the minutes and financial statement. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by John Smith and seconded by John Finlayson to approve the request presented by Police Chief Neal Burks to declare surplus properties of (2) 2004 Ford Police cars, Street Department's 1993 Dodge Ram and 1990 GMC, and Selmer Utilities' 1999 Dodge and call for an auction sell tentatively set for October 2nd, 2010. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by John Smith to approve using the Park & Recreation account as a clearing account for the upcoming \$15,000 Tennessee Downtown Grant. Motion seconded by John Finlayson. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Recreation Director Sybil Dancer reported that the plans included purchasing twelve benches with ends displaying musical symbols and or instruments constructed by local metal designers to help promote the Rockabilly Festival. Plans also include the purchase of banners to place on the lampposts along Court Ave for promoting special events. Any unused funds remaining will be for promoting the farmers market.

Motion by Paul Simpson to authorize City Attorney Abernathy and Fire Chief Carr to negotiate a settlement with Ford Motor Credit concerning the defective rescue truck. Motion seconded by John Smith. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Russell Ingle presently working at the Chamber of Commerce reported that there were three or four good industrial possibilities. He stated that we were in the top three with one of the best prospects. Russell invited everyone to attend and celebrate the 30th consecutive year that McNairy County has achieved Three Star recognition at the Governors Award banquet in Nashville.

Motion by Paul Simpson and seconded by Lloyd Tennyson to pass on second reading an ordinance to amend the text of the Selmer Municipal Zoning Ordinance by establishing improvement and surety standards for Site Plan review and Mobile Home Parks. All five voted yes. Motion carried. 2nd reading passed. Ordinance No 597 passed.

Motion by Edward Smith and seconded by John Smith to approve on second reading the ordinance to amend the text of the Selmer Municipal Zoning Ordinance modifying Multi-Family requirements in the B-2 Central Business District. All five voted yes. Motion carried. 2nd reading passed. Ordinance No. 598 passed.

Motion by Lloyd Tennyson and seconded by Edward Smith to approve the Initial Resolution authorizing the issuance of not to exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000) General Obligation Bonds for refinancing the town's debt. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Paul Simpson and seconded by Lloyd Tennyson to adopt a resolution authorizing the issuance of General Obligation Refunding Bonds of the City of Selmer, Tn for the purpose of refunding all or a portion of certain outstanding General Obligations; making provision for the issuance, sale and payment of said bonds; establishing the terms thereof and the disposition of proceeds from; and providing for the levy of taxes for the payment of principal of premium, if any, and interest on the bonds. Roll call: John Finlayson—yes, Paul Simpson—yes, Edward Smith—yes, John Smith—No, Lloyd Tennyson---yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Paul Simpson to pass on first reading the ordinance amending Ordinance No. 565 of Title 15 of the Selmer Municipal Code relative to automated traffic enforcement cameras on speeding and “Robocop” by charging the fine without the addition of court cost on speeding. Motion seconded by Edward Smith. John Finlayson—yes, Paul Simpson—yes, Edward Smith—yes, John Smith—yes, Lloyd Tennyson—No. Motion carried. 1st reading passed.

Motion by Paul Simpson to approve the request of Luke Delavergne for \$1,700 presently needed to reach the \$50,000 goal of the Carl Perkins Center for 2010. Motion seconded by John Finlayson. Amount amended and accepted from the original \$1,500 to \$1,700 by John Smith so that the needed \$50,000 goal would be complete. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by John Smith and seconded by John Finlayson to approve a resolution establishing the Selmer Farmer’s Market. All five voted yes. Motion carried.
