

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen met in regular session April 13th, 2011 at 7:00 P.M. in Selmer City Hall. Mayor David Robinson and all five Board of Aldermen were present as follows: John Finlayson, Paul Simpson, Edward Smith, John Smith, and Lloyd Tennyson.

The meeting opened with prayer by Russell Ingle of Fellowship Church followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States flag led by Mr. Carl Anderson.

The minutes were approved and a motion was made by Paul Simpson and seconded by Lloyd Tennyson to accept the financial statement. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

A report was given by Recreational Director Sybil Dancer concerning upcoming events such as the Grand Opening of the Farmers Market and first Green Market set for Saturday April 16th, 2011 and plans for lots of Easter activities in the park as well as the downtown area. An informative update followed by Russell Ingle about the Rockabilly event scheduled for June the 11th, 2011.

Motion by John Smith and seconded by Edward Smith to pass on second reading an ordinance to amend the text of the Selmer Municipal Zoning Ordinance adding transportation uses to B-1 (General Business), M-1 (Industrial), and Special-Impact Industrial (S-I) Districts. Motion seconded by Edward Smith. (Cleaning up text around the UPS building.) All five voted yes. Motion carried. Ordinance No. 601 passed.

A hearing requested by Joe Nathan Wyatt a street department employee was set for Monday May 2nd at 6:00 P.M. in Selmer City Hall.

Mayor Robinson announced the new recycling program beginning May 6th, 2011 and encouraged participation.
