Richard Ashe led everyone in the pledge of allegiance to the United States flag of America.

Motion by Johnny Norris and seconded by J.T Hawkins to approve the minutes of May 10, 2016. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by John Finlayson and seconded by Johnny Norris to accept the financial statement. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by John Finlayson and seconded by Nicky Atkins to pass on first reading an ordinance amending the FY 2016 Sanitation Budget. All five voted yes. Motion carried. 1st Reading Passed.

Motion by Johnny Norris and seconded by John Finlayson to approve the Liquor Application for "Selmer Tobacco Beverage Mart", 837 Mulberry Ave, Selmer, TN of V. & D. 45 South Mart, Inc. requested by Jayeshkumar A. Patel, Varshaben R. Patel, Heena R. Patel and grant the Certificate of Compliance to them for a retail package store. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by John Finlayson and seconded by Nicky Atkins to approve the Liquor Application for "45/64 Liquor Barn", 611 A Mulberry Ave., Selmer, TN requested by Prakashkumar B. Patel and Shilpaben P. Patel and grant the Certificate of Compliance to them for a retail package store. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Nicky Atkins asked if flowers could be sent to both victims of the Saturday tragedy. Mayor Smith replied, "Yes, by all means"!
