

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen met in regular session February 9, 2021 at 7:00 P.M. in Selmer City Hall. Mayor John Smith and all five Board of Aldermen were present as follows: John Austin, John Finlayson, J.T. Hawkins, Johnny Norris, and Willie Sain.

The meeting opened with prayer by Street Superintendent Raymond Ouellette followed by the pledge of allegiance to the United States flag of America led by John Finlayson.

Motion by John Austin and seconded by Johnny Norris to approve the minutes of January 2021. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Johnny Norris and seconded by Willie Sain to accept the financial statement of January 2021. All five voted yes. Motion carried.

Department reports were given.

Motion by Johnny Norris and seconded by Willie Sain to approve and grant authorization for the Selmer Utility Division to make increases in the price of tap fees charged as necessary.

All five voted yes.

Motion carried.

Motion by J. T. Hawkins and seconded by John Finlayson to approve and grant authorization for the Selmer Utility Division to increase the after hours reconnection fee from \$35.00 to \$50.00.

All five voted yes.

Motion carried.

Motion by Johnny Norris and seconded by John Austin to approve the request of Selmer Fire Department to apply for the Governor's Highway Safety Grant in the amount of \$10,000 with no match required.

All five voted yes.

Motion carried.

Motion by J.T. Hawkins and seconded by John Austin to approve the request of Selmer Fire Department to apply for the Safer Grant estimated at approximately \$350,000 over a three year period with no match required.

All five voted yes.

Motion carried.

Motion by Willie Sain and second by Johnny Norris to approve the request of Selmer Fire Department to apply for the Fire Prevention Grant estimated at \$20,000 with a \$1,000 match.

All five voted yes.

Motion carried.
